Our mission is to conduct translational research focused on innovative approaches to prevention and intervention practices for individuals living with substance use problems. Funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR), CRISM operates under the umbrella of the Institute of Neuroscience, Mental Health, and Addictions (INMHA).

About the CRISM Atlantic Node:

The <u>CRISM Atlantic Node</u> is hosted at Dalhousie University, Halifax, Nova Scotia. Recognizing the unique challenges of substance use within Atlantic Canadian communities, the CRISM Atlantic Node was established to bring together regional representation and Indigenous leaders identify, inform, and support interdisciplinary research and knowledge translation, enhancing substance use interventions and practices for those residing in Newfoundland & Labrador, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, and Nova Scotia.

As an Online Communications RA within the CRISM Atlantic Node, you will be involved in supporting and amplifying our initiatives, promoting our research, and fostering engagement within the Atlantic Canadian region. Responsibilities will include:

- Research: Explore and discover research in substance use, mental health, and addictions, and contribute to highlighting it within the network and the node.
- Monitoring and Tracking Information: Support information gathering, including analytics, on the research related activities of CRISM Atlantic members and affiliates. This information will assist in enhancing and informing the Atlantic Node's communications and knowledge dissemination activities.
- Content Development: Contribute to the creation of compelling content that may lead to publications and grants.
- Newsletter and social media: Contribute to CRISM Atlantic newsletters and social media posts helping to keep the community informed about ongoing research projects, potential collaborations, and funding prospects.





- Networking: Actively engage within the node, fostering connections and participating in CRISM Atlantic hosted events, both online and in-person.
- Mentorship: Receive guidance and mentorship from CRISM Atlantic Coordinating Core team members facilitating your growth in science communications.
